Using a strong evidence-base the conference brings together leading figures in clinical practice, academic research, and patient experience. We will discuss the key challenges faced in relation to child and adolescent mental health in the fast paced digital environment. Through a variety of speakers and groups, we will hear about different perspectives, both positive and negative experiences and how we, who support young people, can help them to rise to these new challenges.

Many people lack an awareness of the digital landscape, possibly because they have grown up in a different context with less exposure to communication technology, and as such potentially do not engage with them in the same way that our young people do.
